#### Hybrid Plant of the Evening Grown by

Cary Polis *Vanda Fuchs Delight* 



Registered in the 80's, this cross has pretty much held its own since. There are plenty of named varieties around, and it has also been used extensively in further breeding. It's easy enough to see the influence of *V. sanderiana* In the breeding, giving the large, well shaped flowers. And of course the *V. coerulea* giving the striking blue coloration and tesselation.

#### Specie Plant of the Evening Grown by

Tinka Riddell Vanda bensonii



Vanda bensonii comes from India, Myanmar and Thailand where it grows as an epiphyte on deciduous trees in predominantly deciduous forests. Because of this it needs

quite high light to flower well and prefers a dry spell in Winter to mimic the dry season. I'm not certain and it would take someone more knowledgeable than me, however I have a feeling this plant might in fact be *Vanda brunnea*.

Angie Sulfaro Miltonia Honolulu



This plant is getting bigger and better every year and the photo hardly does it justice. Unfortunately also, this would be lucky to be half the flowers open, and we will probably miss it at its best before the next monthly meeting. Very well grown by Angie.

#### Novice Plant of the Evening Grown by

Michael & Sheree Howard Dendrochilum magnum





Dendrochilum magnum is the largest and most spectacular of the genus, hence the name I suppose. With leaves up to 400mm and inflorescences even longer, when it starts to be a large plant it can take up a lot of room in the orchid house, but certainly well worth it. As with all Dendrochilum, it's

best grown into a large specimen plant to show it at its best, and loves moisture. I imagine like *Coelogyne* they would take well to a water-well pot.
