Specie Plant of the Evening Grown by C. Polis
Cattleya trianae var. *backhouseana*

This plant had great fresh flowers, with very vivid colour. It also went on to win champion at our winter show (or at least another plant of the same thing). Another great example of a great grower doing what they do best. In November 1936, *Cattleya trianae* was chosen as the national flower of Colombia, where it is endemic. It was chosen as the flower that best represents Colombia due to the high diversity of orchids and the fact that the type flower has yellow, blue and red on the lip similar to the

Colombian flag. Like many *Cattleyas*, its natural habitat is as an epiphyte in cloud forests and in the wild is now critically endangered due to habitat destruction.

Paphiopedilum Orchilla 'Chilton'



Great to see Rod take out champion hybrid after his informative talk the meeting before on exactly these plants – complex *Paphiopedilum* hybrids. Just goes to show he knows exactly what he was talking about. This plant had the most beautiful colours through it, particularly the shades of purple through the dorsal sepal, and this photo under the hall lights doesn't do it justice. After seeing the interest from our members at Rods talk, I would love to see more people growing these. If anyone is interested, I can highly recommend joining the *Paph* society; a chance to learn from and see plants grown by some of the best growers in the country.

Bulbophyllum shephardii (syn. *crassulifolium*)



Whilst individually the flowers on this may not be spectacular, by god were the 3 plants of this benched thumping specimens!!! And not the usual unruly giants that take up half a table either. Compact, incredibly grown and very well flowered; everything to look for in a good specimen plant. One of these also went on to win champion at the winter show. Like most of the Australian Bulbos, despite small flowers they put on a great display!
