Hybrid Plant of the Evening



Coelogyne Burfordiense

Large for a *Coelogyne*, this primary hybrid is over one hundred years old, having been registered in England in 1911. A hybrid between *Coel. asperata* and *pandurata*, it is not uncommon to buy plants of *pandurata* only to find out upon flowering that they are *Burfordiense*. An easy indicator is the colour of the raised parts of the labellum, white in the specie and brown in the hybrid. Another great *Coelogyne* grown by Guy (and notice it is in a waterwell pot).
