NOVICE OF EVENING Stanhopea graveolens



Grown by Kathleen Nelson.

A cool growing epiphyte or lithophyte from Mexico, Guatemala and Honduras in forests up to 2700 meters in elevation. Very well flowered with a good flower count and still 2 spikes to open. A great display

Specimen of Evening: Dendrochilum uncatum v longispicatum grown by Paul McDonough



Found in the Philippines and Taiwan as a small sized, warm to cold growing epiphyte or lithophyte occurring at elevations of 500 to 2300 meters. A showy Dendrochilum that holds its flowers well out from the foliage.

Species of Evening: Stanhopea inodora grown by Seb Torrisi



Another great Stanhopea, this one is found in Mexico, Belize and Nicaragua in wet montane forests on trees at elevations of 800 to 1500 meters as a medium sized, hot to cool growing epiphyte or occasional terrestrial along roads on steep banks.

Hybrid of Evening: Epi. Volcano Trick grown by Angie Sulfaro



Always a crowd favourite, the striking orange colour really stands out and with the large, well presented flowers, as well as a high flower count, it makes a great display on the bench. Always commented on by many whenever it is shown.
