#### Cary's Ramble:

Not a lot has been happening at my place orchidwise at the moment for a few reasons. My work situation is changing and this has been a major distraction, we have family up from Tasmania for 3 weeks and St Ives Committee commitments are taking their toll as well. The orchids have taken a bit of a back seat so to speak. On top of that I'm off to Cairns for a week. You are probably thinking that this is orchid related but no, it is a family holiday. However, I am intending to sneak up to the Atherton Tableland for a day trip. I have put it to Jill that she could come with me but so far she is quite suspicious about getting dragged into the bush to go exploring.

Doing the walk past at home is not really revealing a lot as far as pests go except that there has been a little bit of scale in the hothouse. This gets spot sprayed when found. Surprisingly, even after all the rain that we've had, there are still very few fungal problems happening in the shade house. The thing that really has impressed me this season is how some orchids have absolutely thrived with all the rain that we've had. Sarcochlius falcatus plants are absolutely jumping out of their skins, with very plump green roots and spikes coming everywhere. They truly are one of my favourite species. Among the other things benefitting are most of the things growing in water well pots. Things like Coelogynes, Dendrochilums, Lycastes and Maxillarias. You can't beat rain to water your plants. It definitely contains elements that enhance growth such as nitrogen and oxygen/ozone. As I have alluded in my report, we have a busy month coming up, but after that, there will be a lot of repotting and plant maintenance and care coming up. Spring is known as a time for renewal and this definitely applies to a lot of orchids and this is the time when, as growers we can enhance this process. The same old story applies: the more time you spend on your plants the better they will perform, even mundane tasks like pulling out weeds as you walk past. David Hemmings gave a talk recently about how he grows his plants and he says that he does the walk past 3 times a day. So it is important even if you do nothing because you might see something that will need attention sometime. Anyway, that's all I've got for you this month.

Go out and enjoy your plants.
