Ramble: By Cary Polis

We recently had an enquiry from a member re fertilising ie when, how often, what type etc. There are many different ways and variations on fertilising your plants. There is absolutely no doubt that a well thought out and regular feeding regime can be hugely beneficial to your plants. Before we talk about what fertiliser to use let's talk about delivery systems. Firstly there is slow release, which is really meant to be a time saving measure. So, you would use this at repotting time and then reapply at regular intervals usually 9-12 months. There are granular fertilisers as well but these can be problematic because there is no dosage control so they might do more harm than good when applied directly to the pot. Then we come to the liquid fertilisers. When used properly and regularly, they are highly effective. Application can be via a watering can, pump or phisonex system.

As for me, I try to feed weekly at half the recommended strength. Feeding is far more effective when the roots are already hydrated, so after rain or the day after watering is ideal. When my collection was small the watering can would suffice but things are out of hand now. I moved to a 90 litre tank with a pump and this proved problematic due to hygiene issues making it virtually impossible to control pathogens. So I went away from that and thought that I would try foliar feeding with my Swagman Sprayer. This seemed to work okay but I decided to go more direct and now I water it in with the spray attachment removed. This is working well and the plants are definitely looking much better, but it is time-consuming because I need to fill the sprayer about 8 times. The good thing is that while doing this, I am able to identify any problems or new buds etc.

So, which fertiliser? For me, the simple answer is Peters Finisher. I may combine this with a bit of molasses or Seasol and lately the odd dose of Auxenone. I only ever add one of these at any one time. In spring it might be beneficial to use a high nitrogen fertiliser since the plants will be in active growth. There are also organic fertilisers that you can use eg Powerfeed, Charlie Carp etc. One needs to be aware that with some of these organic fertilisers that they can stain white or light coloured flowers and this might be an issue if you are fertilising through an overhead watering system. So you can see that there are a lot of different ways to feed your plants. I hope this article helps. At the end of the day you need to devise a system that suits your situation. Happy growing
