Cary's Ramble:

I have just spent 2 weeks in Tasmania and got back just before the auction. Going away for any length of time always presents problems for an orchid grower on how to manage the collection in absentia. Some people just leave it to automatic

watering. I'm not a great fan of this because it invariably leads to some plants being overwatered and some being underwatered. Sometimes there might be a complete failure of the system and one could return to a total disaster. Fortunately for me, my good friend Paul McDonough does my watering for me while I'm away and his wife Robin waters the gardens etc. Relying on your children to do it is a risky exercise. Mine just don't get it, but their might be some hope with my daughter Katie. Apart from that, invariably my kids are usually too busy. One of the best things about coming back is when you check out your plants (for me this is usually before I unload the car and go into the house) upon return. It can be quite exciting because the progress while you were away can be quite dramatic even to the point where something might be in full bloom when you didn't even notice any buds before you left. I have to say that I was pleasantly surprised this time with some fantastic flowers: Oncidium concolor, Vanda dearii, Vanda ustii, Dendrobium callipes, Brassavola perrinii and Bifrenaria tyrianthina among others. I can see that the removal of the neighbour's trees back in August is starting to pay dividends where my plants are concerned. Of course, the challenge of splitting, dividing and repotting some of my huge specimen plants remains and I know that I will just have to bite the bullet sooner rather than later. At least my plants are not looking too bad at the moment with very few pests and strong healthy growths, but weeds are a perennial problem which is only exacerbated by regular feeding and watering. What's good for your plants is also good for the weeds. Often when doing the walkpast I can get bogged down with weeding, but then again, it's part of the process. Anyway, the way I look at it, any time that you spend out there with your plants is time well spent no matter how insignificant it might seem. Happy growing.
