# Cary's Ramble.

The past few weeks have been busy for me so the orchids could have done with more attention. However, I have managed to keep up with the feeding. I used to do it out of a 90 litre tank, but found that a sludge developed in the bottom of it because the pump would never empty it completely and so it became a breeding ground for pathogens. Now I use my Swagman sprayer with the nozzle removed. It is definitely more awkward this way but water quality is assured which makes for healthier plants.

Pests are still quite active, especially aphids, scale and dendrobium beetle. I just deal with these as I see them. Once again, this is where the walkpast is critical.

The weeds are still growing like mad and of course this is one of the side-effects of regular feeding. Anything that you do to maximise the growth of your plants will do the same for the weeds. Weeds love waterwell pots with all that extra moisture. There are some people who advocate spraying weeds with Aerogard (yes, Aerogard) and it does work, but you need to be extremely careful not to harm or kill your plants. Bill Dobson tried it once with his Laelia purpuratas and did quite a lot of harm by burning off numerous new growths. I'm happy to pull the weeds by hand.

In the last few months I have mounted quite a few plants mostly miniature types such as Cadetia taylori, Oncidium longipes, Neolehmannia porpax, Dockrillia rigida and some different Bulbophyllums. The first couple of months are crucial for success and I normally lay them flat in a cool spot and keep them well watered to allow them to get established so as to minimise losses. Mounted plants are not for everyone as they need frequent watering, but can be quite spectacular and rewarding. Most of the mounts have been cork. Guy Cantor has been trying cork tile and so far it seems ok. Hopefully I'll be able to achieve a lot more in the coming month.
