#### Cary's Ramble:

It's been a bit of a quiet month for me orchidwise due to illness and all the rain that we've been having is not conducive to getting out and working on plants especially when it's bleak and cold as well. However I still managed to do a few things like clear out the odd casualty and rearrange plants where buds are being interfered with by neighbouring plants etc. In fact, as you should know by now, this is all to do with the regular walkpast which allows you to pick up on these things before it is too late. Thankfully the pest situation has calmed down a bit but we should always be vigilant. I've noticed that my Laelia purpurata, tenebrosa and anceps plants are powering along with new growths and hefty green root tips and some of these are in need of repotting and of course when they are like this it is the ideal time but unfortunately I just haven't got to them yet. At least they are fairly forgiving when it comes to repotting.




All this heavy rain is not really giving pots and dishes much of a chance to dry out and there is a real danger of fungal problems. Of course the rain certainly suits some plants, especially things like Coelogyne, Dendrochilum, Maxillaria and even Sarcochilus falcatus. another thing that all this rain does is to really flush out the pots to the point where fertiliser beads might be prematurely depleted,

so I intend to step up the feeding when the rain abates even though we are in winter. At St Ives last year I picked up a few seedlings of Dendrobium (Red Dame x canaliculatum). The canaliculatum would tend to ensure that the plants will be of a compact habit and this made them an attractive proposition for me (apart from the fact that I'm mad about canaliculatum anyway). These plants have grown extremely well in such a short time and I'm a little excited because some of them are showing signs of flower spikes. So I'm keeping my fingers crossed that firstly they will reach maturity and I'll get to see the flowers, and that I won't be disappointed. Anyway, that's the beauty of seedlings: a seedling is a genetic individual which means if you have a good one, no-one else has it. Buying a seedling is always a lottery but if you have good parentage you have a better chance of getting something worthwhile. Sometimes you have to wait years to flower a seedling but in this case, because of the canaliculatum parent, if there are no mishaps, I should get to see the flowers this season. One should always have a few seedlings on the go. It is just another facet of orchid growing and it provides the potential of ending up with a spectacular one-off plant.
